Getting Acquainted with the Program

Matthew 28:19 says, “Therefore go and make disciples...” Jesus’ command was for all of His followers. There is great need for discipleship among the 18-25 year olds and therefore, this age range is the focus group of this program. Through Bair Lake Bible Camp’s 50+ years of existence, we see evidence of the need to disciple those transitioning into adulthood. As a result, we will partner with the body of Christ (parents, mentors, pastors, etc.) in Jesus’ great commission.

Our mission statement at Bair Lake Bible Camp is to exist as a launching pad for all people to make Jesus Christ known in their community, country and world. As we seek to help launch this age group into the world, we will do so according to God’s word as laid out in 2 Timothy 3:16-17 which says, “All scripture is God breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work.” Launching equipped young adults for Kingdom work is the greatest desire and ultimate goal of **OUTFITTERS**. This will be accomplished through service, structured and intentional instruction, discussion, and programs that incorporate teaching, rebuking, correcting and training based on and formed by God’s word.

Specifics of the program will help the young adults as they train themselves to be Godly (1 Timothy 4:7). Though we will establish Biblically based boundaries, we will also intentionally leave opportunities for the participants to make ongoing, wise decisions.

The commitment level required for this program to be effective is significant for all involved. The coordinators of this program along with the participants themselves must commit to an excellent pursuit of making and being Disciples of Christ. We will also seek to find supporting individuals such as parents, mentors, pastors, etc. who will commit to engage in the discipleship process with us.

Program Specifics

The goal of OUTFITTERS is to be part of the equipping process for young adults so that they might live holy lives in Jesus Christ and be effective for His Kingdom.

OUTFITTERS has three main components:

1. Spiritual development will be pursued through:

- weekly Bible study
- weekly chapel/teaching
- corporate prayer
- weekly individual mentor meetings
- weekly group topical teaching
- monthly book club
- regularly scheduled solitude

2. Career and Ministry development through experiences in:

- guest services
- food service
- housekeeping
- office operations
- site and facility maintenance
- Adventure Challenge Education
- programming
- assistance in pursuing domestic or international missions
- assistance in developing a trade
- assistance in pursuing education

3. Personal responsibility improvement through training in:

- finances
- physical fitness
- time management
- personal care issues
- relationships

These three areas represent approximately 30 hours of work/service and 20 hours of training/instruction per week.

Outfitters Weekly Event Schedule

The Feast (Bible Study)

Tuesdays 3:30 - 5:30 p.m.

The Word of God is our daily bread and sustenance. We are not rationed small portions; we can feast on the spiritual food of the scriptures! **The Feast** will include Bible study and discussion of the previous week's assignments.

The Furnace* (Prayer Meeting)

Wednesdays 6:30 - 8:00 a.m.

We'll be on our knees together in **The Furnace** on behalf of Bair Lake Bible Camp, our community, our nation and our world.

The Return* (Corporate Worship)

Wednesdays 2x per month 7:00 - 9:00 p.m.

Location: TBA (Reid home, PAC conference room, off-site, etc.)

"Every blessing you pour out I'll turn back to praise." During **The Return**, we get to take the blessings we've received during the prior week and turn them back as praise unto the Lord. This will also be a time to share how we're seeing God's hand at work.

Tool Time (Topical Teaching Time)

Thursdays 7:00 - 9:00 p.m. (time subject to change)

Location: PAC Conference Room

Various teachers will provide tools and training for discipleship. **Tool Time** will also include great dialogue about the topic at hand.

Pillars* (Monthly Book Club)

First Friday of the month 7:00 - 9:00 a.m.

Location: PAC

Each month we will read a complimentary book that will serve as a supportive resource to that month's emphasis. At **Pillars** we will engage in discussion about the ideas discovered in these fantastic resources.

***BLBC staff are welcome and encouraged to participate in these activities.**

-Monthly Newsletters will be required by each participant as well in the form of a blog.

Results

As the participant serves in various departments at Bair Lake Bible Camp, **OUTFITTERS** will invest greatly in them. The desired result of the program is to equip individuals for Kingdom work. Therefore, during the two years in **OUTFITTERS**, participants will receive ongoing teaching and training times which will equip them to:

- discover personalized career and ministry opportunities
- study God's word effectively
- formulate and live according to a Biblical worldview
- establish an effective prayer life
- embrace God's best for their lives.

Timeline

OUTFITTERS is designed to be a two year discipleship program which will begin September 1st each year. Ideally, the participants will serve as a member of the Senior Staff team during the summer prior to beginning the program, though this is not required. The first year in the program will conclude with the participants taking on leadership responsibilities during the summer. The second year will conclude with a summer of individualized service in order to follow the Lord's leading in their lives. This may include continued service at Bair Lake Bible Camp, or it may involve other ministry opportunities such as urban ministry, international missions or employment. **OUTFITTERS** will serve as a resource for them during this final summer as well as a means of prayer support.

Commitment

In addition to teaching and training, **OUTFITTERS** commits to provide the participants with the following:

- Housing
- Meals* \$50 food gift card every month Sept - April
- Utilities
- Materials (all books, studies, etc.)
- Service Project supplies and transportation
- Conference registration fees and transportation
- Assistance with mission trip (national and international) costs

*Meals provided when guests and/or campers are being served as well as leftovers when available

We ask that the participants commit to the following:

- perseverance in study and service
- flexibility in scheduling
- completion of weekly/monthly assignments
- attendance to all* **OUTFITTERS** scheduled events, meetings and gatherings
- adherence to the Bair Lake Bible Camp Code of Conduct
- submission to those in authority
- completion of the **OUTFITTERS** Discipleship Program
- responsibility for personal expenses

*Appropriate absences (illness, etc.) will be excused.

The nature of Camping requires people that are very flexible, and love the challenge of something different every day. Listed below are a number of areas that our Staff have the opportunity to serve in.

Counselors:

Works under the supervision of the program director and are responsible for the direction and guidance of 10 campers each week. A counselor and a junior counselor live in each cabin with the campers and use every opportunity to interact with them on spiritual topics through Bible study, fellowship time, one-on-one time and daily living situations.

Day Camp Counselors:

Works under the supervision of the day camp director to bring a daily program of activities and Bible lessons to day campers. A counselor and junior counselor will build relationships with kids during the day and serve in other capacities in the evenings.

Waterfront Personnel:

Works under the supervision of the program director and are responsible for overseeing all waterfront activities, including Pool, Lakefront, and Boating. Must pass Red Cross certification. (Training provided by the Bair Lake).

Programming:

Works directly with the week's program director setting up and running activities specific to that week's camp. Communicates the needs and schedule of the director to the other staff.

Maintenance:

Works under the supervision of the Facilities Director to provide services in grounds keeping and building / vehicle maintenance. Works closely with junior staff in a managing/discipling role.

Housekeeping:

Works under the supervision of the Housekeeping Manager to keep the facilities clean and inviting for the campers. Works closely with junior staff in a managing/ discipling role.

Adventure Challenge Education:

Works under the supervision of the Program Manager to run all adventure activities for the summer camp programs. Be trained and proficient in the proper techniques of small group facilitation.

(Training provided by Bair Lake)

Kitchen:

Works with Food Service Manager and Head Cook to manage junior staff in the running of the dining room and dish room. Prepping tables, keeping food refilled, clean up, and dishes. Works closely with junior staff in a managing/ discipling role

Audio/Visual:

Works with marketing on supplying the A/V needs of each weeks camps, including sound systems, production of weekly videos and photos. Previous experience desired.
